Directions for Creating World War II Flash Cards

- 1) Cut your cards in half (you should have 16 cards 32 when cut).
- 2) On the back side of the card (the lined side), write the definition for each item (#1-31) from your definition sheet.
 - ***Points will be deducted for missing or misspelled words & for messy work.

 REMEMBER! DO NOT write the main word you are defining on this side of the card (these are <u>flash cards</u> to study with).
- 3) Cut out picture (& label) #1 (Allies) & glue to the front (the side with no lines) of definition card #1.

After you have finished gluing the first card, THEN, continue - ONE AT A TIME - to cut out remaining pix & glue to definition cards - ONE AT A TIME!

In other words...

Cut each one individually and glue to the matching card before cutting out the next one.

4) Keep all your pieces in the Ziploc bag. Your flash cards will be scored according to the following rubric:
