Station 1: Medical (Covey's room)








Station 3: Mental Examiner (Mayfield's room)








Station 1: Medical/Doctors





(SC) 1. scalp for ringworm or lice

(B) 5. Back for straightness

(E) 2. Eyes for trachoma

(P) 6. Lungs or other

3. Throat

(L) 7. Limp

4. Hands

(X) 8. Mental problems



II. Mark 4 people, other than Wolf Haas and Sophia Albanese, with an (X) for mental reasons and send them to the mental examiner. Also send Wolf and Sophia to the mental examiner.

III. Medical Detention:

*These people must be detained (write the time on a sticky note and send them to the detention area).

*Antonio D'Angelo - Blind (E)

*Josef Valko - Walks with a limp (L)

*Annie McKernan – Tuberculosis (P)

*Olga Dobrynin – Fever: Typhus (P)

*Wolf Haas - (X)

When these people get back in line after being detained (they should have stayed 10 minutes - check the time), tell them that they are not cured and will have to go back to their homeland (to the deportation area).



Medical Detention:

This person has mental problems and should be detained: Sophia Albanese – Illiterate (X)

IF NO PROBLEMS EXIST, SEND THEM TO THE LEGAL EXAMINER. ©

Station 2: Legal Examiner

- 1. Ask to see their passport, this will tell you their country.
- 2. Read the answers to the questions on their card, review with immigrant.
- 3. For question 11, ask to SEE the \$10. If the immigrant does not have the money, he must be DEPORTED if he/she cannot somehow come up with the money. Mark FAIL on the card, and send the immigrant to the end of the line to try to borrow money. If he/she is unsuccessful, DEPORT him/her.
- 4. If the immigrant answers YES to question 15, DEPORT him/her with a chance!
- 5. Check the quota sheet. If the quota is reached for that country, explain that they must be deported.
- 6. If part of a family is deported, the rest of the family will have to decide what to do. The whole family will have to get out of line to think about the situation and decide what to do.
- 7. If the immigrant sufficiently answers all of the questions, mark the PASS on the their card and send him/her to "The Land of Milk and Honey" America!
- 8. Mark front of passport "Issued at Ellis Island, December 19,1912.

Station 3: Mental Examiner

- 1. Ask the immigrant to take a seat.
- 2. Ask the immigrant to tell a little about himself/herself...
- 3. Give the immigrant at least two of the following:
 - a. ask questions on a card
 - b. make them do a puzzle
 - c. work 10 math problems
 - d. read a paragraph from a primary reading book
 - e. look at a picture and describe what is happening
- 4. If you have a lot of people waiting, have students fill in the card.
- 5. After they complete their tests, send them back to the doctor to be rechecked.
- 6. DO NOT DEPORT anyone for mental illness. When an immigrant passes the tests, complete card and mark PASS and send with the immigrant, to the doctor.



Station 4: Detention Center

- 1. Students must sit and read for 10 minutes. Watch the clock and look at the time on the immigrants' passports.
- 2. After 10 minutes, immigrants may return to the doctor to be rechecked. He/She will check the time on their passports to be sure it has been 10 minutes.
- 3. Be sure to leave the area you were in clean and neat.








Deportation

Have students take a seat and write a letter back home or to a friend in America requesting assistance in trying to enter







America!





- 1. Welcome immigrant into America!
- 2. Check passport to make sure student was admitted into America.
- 3. Instruct student to pick up a graph art worksheet, and have a seat at a table they should use the code & colored pencils provided to color in the worksheet of the Statue of Liberty.
- 4. Offer the student some milk, honey graham crackers, and a ¼ of a banana (this is the first time most immigrants had tasted bananas!)
- 5. Students may chat quietly with other immigrants who have made it into America!
