alley: a narrow street or passageway between buildings



assassination: to murder a usually important person by a surprise or secret attack



casket: a box or case to hold a dead body; coffin



conductor: a person who collects fares in a public means of transportation (as a bus or railroad) *Also used to describe those who helped slaves escape to the North through the Underground Railroad).



Emancipation Proclamation: Abraham Lincoln's executive declaration pronouncing that all persons held as slaves in areas in rebellion against the United States would henceforth be free



fugitive: a person who runs away or tries to escape



racism: a belief that certain races of people are by birth and nature superior to others



sewer: a usually covered drain to carry off water and sewage

tyrant: a ruler who has no legal limits on his or her power by law or constitution

Underground Railroad: a system of cooperation in the U.S. before 1883 by which slaves were secretly helped to reach the North or Canada
